
























ENJOYING OUR PICNIC TABLES FROM THE P.T.A.

FROM OUR INSTRUCTIONAL COACHES

Summer is coming and maybe with it, a slower pace. This could be a good time to gather together some supplies for your child to practice having a "maker mindset" by building, tinkering, designing, being a scientist, and being a creative problem



solver! Supporting children to have a "maker mindset" helps to build confidence and agency as well as many other skills including creative problem solving and perseverance. Here are some ideas and resources on ways to cultivate a "maker mindset" for your young learner.

- How to Nurture a Maker Mindset Includes great graphic for a quick overview.
- <u>How to set up an Art Cart</u> (or sculpting, tinkering, painting). Self sufficiency is highlighted here.
- <u>Tinkerlab Supplies & Resources</u> This list is helpful if you're looking to freshen up your supplies, or if grandma is looking for a gift for your child. However kids can do *a lot* with recyclables so no need to buy new things.
- <u>Engineering Design Process</u> This visual is used in our K-5 schools and could be used with at home projects too.

"On a self-serve, organized space for making: Children learn to ask and test their own questions; they seek out materials that help them realize **solutions** to **self-designed problems**; you are **treating them with respect based** on the believe that **they can accomplish what they set their minds to**; and finding materials on their own saves you time and **supports** their **independence**." 
